Anonymous donor gives \$5 million to The Umbrella

The Umbrella has announced it is the recipient of a \$5 million donation from the estate of an anonymous donor.

The donation is allocated to The Umbrella's Building The Arts Capital Campaign expenditures to renovate the main building, including the artists' studios, classrooms and common areas, along with access to the building at street level.

Executive Director Jerry Wedge said, "There are not many days that you come into work and get a call that an anonymous estate has just donated \$5,000,000 to your organization. We are all still in a bit of shock. We feel incredibly lucky that this estate had faith in The Umbrella, and in the idea that working artists, and the arts in general, are important to maintaining vibrant communities."
